

P3 - Achieving the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development through local action

SP1 – "The circular city" will focus on how the framework of the circular economy can be integrated with and reinforce other urban sustainability agendas and make urban metabolism more efficient.

SP2 – "Reconciliation and inclusion" will highlight successful approaches of managing urban cultural diversity and integration.

SP3 – "Systemic resilience" will explore a model that includes anticipation, monitoring, response, recovery, learning, and self-monitoring, as well as the role of insurance in promoting resilience.

AFTERNOON

SP4 – "Nature-based solutions" will focus on achieving economic, environmental and social sustainability through nature-based solutions.

SP5 – "Environmental health-driven development" will explore how responding to sustainability challenges has positive ripple effects on public health, be it physical or mental health, and by putting health in the foreground, policy makers can mobilize further support in their communities for local climate action.

Transforming the Outremont yards - A leading project in sustainable urban planning Visit 118 hectares in continuous transformation

The City of Montreal and the University of Montreal are working closely together to transform and redefine the former Outremont yard. Connecting four Montréal boroughs, the Outremont Site promises to be a creative and innovative living environment, both urban and green, where students, researchers, workers, artists and citizens can meet.

The Saint-Michel Environmental Complex - A multifunctional and unique innovation center

The transformation of this former limestone guarry and landfill into the second largest green space in Montreal represents one of the most ambitious environmental restoration projects ever undertaken in urban areas in North America. The park aims at offering a diverse range of activities and will be an ever-growing experimental laboratory focused on knowledge sharing related to environmental technology.



"Quartier des spectacles" - Enjoy 1 km² of Montreal's emotions and cultural diversity

Located in the city-center of Montreal, the "Quartier des spectacles", is its cultural beating heart and is known as the place with the highest concentration and greatest diversity of cultural sites in North America.
